The Prevent Child Abuse Minnesota Speakers Bureau was created in 2004 to provide a forum for dialogue, outreach, and education on the prevention of child abuse and neglect. We provide speakers for private, public, and nonprofit organizations, such as:

About the Speakers

Our volunteer speakers consist of trained community members who have a passion for ending child abuse and neglect. They are knowledgeable about child abuse prevention issues and want to share their experiences with you. Survivors of child abuse (Authentic Voices), concerned citizens, and professionals in the field of child abuse prevention are available to speak on a variety of topics. Our speakers are available to come to your site to address prevention issues of interest to your group.

Speakers Bureau Topics
